ABORIGINAL GRANT

We are so pleased to have received an aboriginal grant. A small group of staff and parents met to plan this years Aboriginal grant application proposal, and thankfully our school has been given the maximum grant of \$3000.!

- Three circular 36" diameter cedar carvings to be displayed around the school (we will request 3 more next year). These are to reflect our new intramural animals and the related teachings from the book which are in alignment with BC core competencies: bear (balance and protection), salmon (critical thinking), orca (noble navigating), beaver (diligent collaborating), raven (creative thinking), wolf (communication). Included in the grant proposal, our school commitment to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Education call to action #62 "This project will help our students to learn about the important historical and contemporary contributions made by Aboriginal people, as well as specific Aboriginal teachings. Students will learn respect for, and have increased knowledge and understanding about Aboriginal culture and teachings. Students will deepen their understanding (identity) of themselves and others from the teachings. Their sense of belonging and connection will increase."

NOTICE TO PARENTS

Dear Parents

Thank you for supporting your Child's growth as a gardener! By nurturing early involvement in gardening, you could be starting your Child off to a lifelong satisfying, healthy and rewarding hobby. Many parents have commented that in the process of helping their Child they have learned a great deal themselves! Here are a few ways that you can help your Child raise a successful garden.

- Please read over the instructions with your child(ren) and give guidance and assistance to make sure they are following the instructions correctly. This is an important part of the educational aspect of the program.
- Make sure they have suitable tools (Child sizes are available), sticks, strings, ruler, scissors, and permanent markers for signs and labels.
- The youngest children need the most help but that help lessens as the child matures, so that senior gardeners are doing all the work themselves.
- Younger children need to be shown how to plant the seeds according the instructions, but the older ones should be able to follow the instructions without assistance.
- We encourage the students to be creative with their signs and labels but it is important to make sure they are rain and sun proof.
