# Promontory Elementary Update – May 28, 2020

Hello, families! This week our staff has been working hard to get ready for the arrival of students next week (some on Monday/Tuesday and some on Wednesday/Thursday). You have heard some specific details from your child's classroom teacher, and you will continue to be informed as we move into June. Thank you so much for assisting us with our planning by informing the Office and the classroom teacher of your plans for your child's attendance. As we look ahead to next week, here are a few important details to remember:

- Most importantly, if your child is sick or displaying any symptoms of a cold, flu or COVID-19, <u>do not send your child to school</u>!
- Buses will run on their regular schedules, with modified seating plans to ensure the separation of students.
- The classroom teacher has informed you of entry and exit times and locations.
- Please have your child arrive as close to the entry and exit time as possible.
- The 2m social distancing rules continue to apply for adults. Please do not gather in groups if you are dropping off your child. Do not plan to come early or linger afterwards. We need your help to clear the pathways as quickly as possible in order to adhere to the social distancing guidelines. "Drop and go".
- The school building will be closed to all non-staff adults. This will help us reduce potential contacts. If you need to access your child, the Office or your child's teacher, you will be asked to phone 604-824-4885 to speak to someone or to make an appointment.
- The teacher will inform you of what your child should bring to school.
- Teachers will go outside more than usual; please ensure your child is dressed for the weather.
- We will ask students to leave all balls at home, as we will be avoiding games like football or competitive soccer that lead to regular contact.
- Children and families who are not scheduled to attend school on any given day are asked to stay away from the schoolgrounds and playing fields between 8am-3pm each day. If children and families who are not in attendance come to the areas we are using for school, it will create many logistical problems for us. Thank you for understanding.
