DROP OFF/PICK UP

We have seen a marked improvement in parking lot flow and mask wearing during drop off and pick up times. Please note if your child is ill on a lunch date, you are welcome to plan ahead of time to come and pick up their lunch at 12 pm from the front office; otherwise please consider it a donation for a child who does not have a lunch. Consistent with previous years, there are NO REFUNDS as this is a PAC fundraiser. Please make sure to make an appointment with the office before showing up at the school.
