CLASSES FOR THE YEAR

Classes have now been set for Grades 1-5 as of today. Our school has over 600 students and we are full at every grade level. Students have had time this week to be taught by all the teachers at their grade level. Your child will be share with you who their teacher will be for this school year. \textcircled

The class placement process that involves many conversations and careful planning among school staff. Staff put thoughtful consideration of each child's social, emotional and academics needs to do to create balance and effective learning environments. The placement of students into classes is a team approach which includes input by the child's current teacher, non-enrolling teachers, school-based team, support staff, the vice principal and principal. This team considers each placement carefully while being mindful that there are wide range of needs and students learn in a variety of ways. Some factors are out of our control such as allocation of number of classes we will have at each grade level, straight or combined classes, or the total number of divisions the school will have. Changes in staff and in enrolment numbers are also a component and can result in teachers teaching a different grade then they did the previous year.

There are many factors that are taken into account in the process:

- Academic achievement and needs
- Learning and Teaching styles



- Instructional groupings
- Social Compatibility of groups and students
- Degree of independence in student work habits
- Integration of children with exceptionalities
- Medical information
- Contractual language

Staff also place students with a compatible group that includes friendship and social dynamics, that will allow for optimal learning environment for each student. Please note that being with the same friend or group of friends, year after year, cannot be the main priority.

With classes now set for the school year, we wish all students a terrific year of learning!

School Supplies

Grades Groups have coordinated their Student Supplies in bulk order to keep costs to a minimum. It also ensures that students have exactly what is needed and allows for consistency. Staff worked hard to ensure little to no significant increase despite the rising cost of supplies. The following is the amount per grade group:

- Kindergarten \$50 (\$40.00 supplies + \$10.00 for Emergency Preparedness Fund)

- Grade 2 \$45
- Grade 3 \$40
- Grade 4 \$40
- Grade 5 \$40

POPCORN

Popcorn Tuesdays are back! Our first popcorn day will be Tuesday, September 19th. The cost for 10 weeks is \$7.50 (\$0.75/bag). You can bring cash/cheque directly to your classroom teacher, or payment can be made online <u>here</u>.

PARKING LOT

Reminder: Please DO <u>NOT</u> **PARK IN THE DROP OFF ZONES IN OUR PARKING LOT**, as that completely disrupts the flow of traffic. We have over 400 families coming and going, and we just do not have capacity for that many vehicles. Please be patient; your courtesy and cooperation help make everyone's day better, and more importantly it increases student safety on the parking lot and sidewalks. Do not leave your car unattended in the drop off/pick up lane between 8:10-8:30am or between 2:00-2:30pm, or you will be creating a significant traffic problem.

SCHOOL BUS EVACUATIONS

Our school bus drivers and teaching staff will be conducting school bus emergency evacuation drills in the next few weeks at our school. One of the methods of evacuation requires students to jump out the back door, with assistance, onto a rubber mat - a height of approximately one meter. Appropriate footwear for this day would help to ensure student safety. Some of the Grade 5 students will be selected to act as helpers. If you have any objections or questions concerning your child's participation in these drills please contact the school or call the Transportation Department at 604-792-1255.

***ALLERGIES – PROMONTORY IS A "NUT AWARE" SCHOOL



Please ensure that you have made your child's classroom teacher and the office **aware of any serious allergies**. **Students that require Epi-pens must wear a fanny pack at all times** with their Epi-pen and other medication in case it is needed. This will ensure that the Epi-pen is immediately available in the event it is needed.

We have a number of students with nut allergies, and at least one class where students have been asked to be "nut free". We ask that families help us keep these students safe. If you send peanut butter, peanuts or peanut products to school, your child may be asked to eat outside of the classroom.

PLEASE NOTE: IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT PARENTS HELP THEIR CHILDREN LEARN TO ADVOCATE FOR THEIR OWN SAFETY; THE FIRST LINE OF SAFETY LIES WITH THE CHILD AND THE KNOWLEDGE THEY HAVE TO KEEP THEMSELVES SAFE.

Many children come to school with life threatening allergies. This can vary from food allergies to certain foods like nuts, fish, dairy etc. or it can be allergies associated with bee stings.

Children with severe allergies that require immediate medical attention should they come into contact with an allergen need to inform the office so the proper documentation and support protocols can be put in place.

Schools often have children with allergies to specific types of nuts such as peanuts and other nut products. For the safety of children, we are asking your cooperation in restricting the use of nut products in lunches or other food items brought to school.

We understand that it can be difficult to know what is in specific food products. For classrooms that have students with severe type of allergies we ask that parents refrain from sending items with these specific food products. It is understood that assuring that a school is absolutely "allergen free" may be difficult and instead ask that community be "nut aware" and identified classrooms be "allergen aware". Thank you for your understanding with this serious health concerns for students and families.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Classroom instructional time is very valuable! **Students must attend regularly and be on time if we want them to do their best learning.** We inform our students that school is their job, and like adults they are expected to be at work and be there on time. **Please make every effort to reinforce regular and prompt arrival to school.** Patterns of regular nonattendance, or lateness, will impact learning, and parents will be contacted by phone or letter seeking support in promoting regular, prompt attendance. School starts at 8:20am. **If your child arrives after 8:25am they will need to check in at the office before proceeding to class.**

REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES *NEW PROCEDURE*

For the safety and security of the children, **if your child is going to be absent or late, please use our NEW "Safe Arrival" program** called School Messenger, located on the front page of our school website, or <u>here</u>. This is a very user-friendly App that can be downloaded to both android and iPhone. This program can be accessed at any time of day. You are still able to report a late or absence over the phone if you prefer. Phone calls can now be directed to 1-833-698-6567 and you can follow the prompts.

SIGNING YOUR CHILD OUT

If you wish to take your child out of school during the school day (i.e., Doctor/Dentist or other appointments), **please call the office** and sign your child out. The office will then call your child's class to have your child come down. It is very important for us to know when a child has left the building/grounds. **Upon returning the same day, please inform the office.**

MESSAGES FOR STUDENTS



During class time we make it a practice to minimize classroom disruptions to teachers and students. Learning time is important. If you have a message for your child during instructional time, please leave a message with our secretaries. We will be sure they receive it. Students are not permitted to use their own technology for texting, phoning, gaming or

taking photos during the school day., and they cannot use our school phone for personal reasons (i.e., to arrange play dates). These types of arrangements are the students' responsibility and are to be made at home prior to coming to school. **CELL PHONES**



There a some students who, for purposes of family safety, have cell phones. Students may call home when they arrive at school and when they are leaving. After that, cell phones are expected to be turned off and put away in a backpack.

Students are not to use the cell phone camera/video option unless there is an educational purpose, and it may only be used with consent, and under the direction of the classroom teacher. There are district policies that apply to the

use of both school and personal devices when used for educational purposes at the school. These practices will be adhered to. It is expected that the use of Social Media at school adheres to these policies. Students will be expected to have completed the <u>Acceptable Use Agreement</u> prior to any use of technology for educational purposed at the school. These forms were sent home electronically last June and we will be sending out reminders again soon.

PLEASE DO NOT EMAIL OR TEXT YOUR CHILDREN DURING SCHOOL/CLASS TIME. OUR STUDENTS HAVE BEEN ASKED TO TURN OFF AND PUT AWAY PHONES UNLESS DIRECTED BY TEACHERS TO USE AS AN INSTRUCTIONAL TOOL AND UNDER THEIR DIRECT SUPERVISION.

ELECTRONIC TOYS AND GADGETS

We ask that students **leave ALL their electronic toys and gadgets at home. We expect that students do not use them at school** (electronic games, etc.). Not only are they a distraction, but things can get damaged and/or go missing and it is difficult for us to be responsible for following up on these incidents.

DOGS AT SCHOOL

We love dogs and all other furry friends. Your pet is in the presence of children at school, and both dogs and children can be unpredictable, so in many cases it may be best choice to leave pets at home. Any dog at the school must be on a leash and controlled by an adult. Please be very cautious when you are near children, or if students ask to pet your dog. Remember that not everyone is a "dog person", and a barking dog can be very scary to some children. Please keep your pet a safe distance from other dogs. Once on the school grounds, it is the responsibility of the adult to maintain control of the pet. Thank you!

LUNCHES

If you drop off lunch for your child, please make sure their name is on it. You can inform the office and we will arrange for your child to receive the lunch; we will not interrupt class time if we can avoid it.

SMOKING ON PREMISES

It has been **district policy to ban smoking on school premises**. Provincial legislation (Bill 10: The Tobacco Sales Amendment Act, 2007, Section 2.2 of the act), **prohibits all persons from smoking or using tobacco, or holding lighted tobacco in, or on school property.** This applies to activities on site in the evening as well (PAC Meetings, concerts, team activities, Family Fun night, etc.). We ask that you refrain from smoking or vaping anything at any time. Thank you for your cooperation in respecting this legislation.

BIKES, SCOOTERS & OTHER WAYS OF ROLLING TO SCHOOL

Bikes and scooters are meant as a way to get to and from school, and they are not to be used on the school grounds. When bringing bikes to school, students should walk their bikes and scooters on the side walk directly to the bike or scooter racks. It is strongly advised that bikes/scooters be locked to reduce the possibility of theft. Students are expected to wear bike helmets when riding bikes/scooters to school. Please leave skateboards/longboards at home.



IN/OUT DAYS

WE WILL GO OUTSIDE MOST DAYS. With the fall weather on its way, we can expect more frequent wet, windy weather. Even on days with drizzle or light rain, children will be sent out for a period of time to get fresh air. The day is long and children do crave exercise and fresh air. PLEASE ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILDREN TO MAKE RESPONSIBLE CHOICES AND ENSURE THEY ARE DRESSED PROPERLY FOR THE WEATHER.

VOLUNTEERS (CRIMINAL RECORD SEARCH)

Once school is well under way and we continue to have the go-ahead to do so, we hope to welcome limited numbers of volunteers to help in the school. It is very important that parents who wish to volunteer at our school in any capacity complete a **Criminal Record Search form** that you **complete and turn in to the RCMP office**. These forms are available at the school office. School Board Policy makes this process a necessity. The positive service parents provide is valued and we encourage you to complete this process in order to enable your involvement. Criminal Record Checks expire after 4 years, so please make sure yours is up to date if you'd like to volunteer!

CHILD CUSTODY/COURT ORDERS

Please make the classroom teacher and the office staff aware of any concerns of this nature that impact upon your child's family situation. The office must have current copies of court orders, custody access documents, and/or documents that limit or restrict access, so the school staff can support enforcement.

BC SCHOOL FRUIT & VEGETABLE NUTRITIONAL PROGRAM +MILK

Our school is involved in a province-wide healthy living initiative. One of the goals is to encourage healthy eating by providing fresh BC fruits and vegetables to our students during class time. Our students will receive these healthy treats 13 times over the school year at no charge! Free milk or soy milk will also be delivered again. A percentage of +Milk delivery will be fortified soy beverage for people with lactose sensitivities. We need volunteers to sort and wash the produce before we deliver it to students. LIBRARY NEWS

NUMBER OF BOOK CHECK OUTS PER STUDENT

During the school year a student may have no more than 3 books on their account at any time. Students need to return their old books in order to take out any new library books.

If a student has not returned their overdue books, they will be asked to pick a "Read and Return Book" to ensure that they have a book to read in the classroom and at home. An intermediate student with multiple missing books may be permitted to sign out an additional book to read in the classroom but it must stay at school until all missing books at home are returned.

Kindergarten 1 Book (After Winter Break, they will be able to take out 2 books). Grade 1 - 2 Books (a "just right reading level book and 1 "choice book"). Grade 2 - 2 Books (a "just right reading level book and 1 "choice books"). Grade 3 - 3 Books (a "just right" reading level book and up to 2 "choice books"). Grade 4 - 3 Books (a "just right reading level book and up to 2 "choice books"). Grade 5 - 3 Books (a "just right reading level book and up to 2 "choice books"). Family Accounts - 10 Books per visit.

DAMAGED OR LOST BOOKS

If a book has not been returned within 2 weeks of its due date, a notice may be sent home with the student for their parents. This intended to help parents find the book, it is not a bill. If a book is returned damaged, a replacement bill may be sent home. Parents are responsible for replacing any damaged library books before their child can continue using the library. If a student has a book that is considered "lost" they could be asked to keep their library books in the classroom until the missing books are found at home and returned. Last year we had many books that were damaged by food, pets, water, and writing. Please be extra vigilant.

KIWANIS SUPER READER PROGRAM

Make reading part of your daily routine and earn rewards! The very successful "Super Reader" program will be back again this year. Students will receive an official green Super Reader Booklet the second week of school, after their first visit to the library. Every night a child reads for 15 minutes they receive a check mark in their booklet. Every 50 nights of reading return the booklet back to your classroom teacher for a reading prize. Parents are allowed to back date the booklet as of September 11, 2023. This program is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club, and Promontory PAC. Happy reading!
