PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

A good conversation starter is talking with your child about what he/she like about learning or enjoy about school, feel most proud about, what he/she is good at and what they would like to get better at, and developing a plan to achieve the goal(s). Conversations, such as these, help to engage children in thinking about what he/she can do continue to grow their skills and helps develop personal ownership.
