Happy New Year, Promontory Families!

# Winter Weather/ Closures \& Inclement Weather 

Winter weather and cold temperatures have now arrived. Please ensure your child is well prepared for the cooler, wet weather having the proper outdoor attire as students will go outside for breaks along with sending a change of socks, pants, mitts in case they become too wet or muddy.

All schools will remain OPEN unless there is heavy snowfall, storm, or circumstance such as power outage that prevents the delivery of instruction. From time-to-time schools are sometimes closed for safety reason in the event of extreme weather conditions. ## Dress for the Weather

With winter season now upon us, there will likely be more snow days ahead, turning our school grounds into a winter wonderland. On school days where snow falls, please have your child come wearing outdoor winter wear so they can play in outside on the fields and playground. Students are encouraged to wear waterproof outdoor clothing such as boots and jackets with hats. Slips and falls do happen from time to time, families are encouraged to include a change of clothe in their child's backpack.

## Main School Parking Lot

To maintain the flow of vehicle traffic, reduce congestion and to allow the district School Bus to be able to drive up Stoneview Dr. to the student loading zone, we are reminding drivers that all vehicles in the center lane have the right away.

Those who utilize the quick-stop double-park strategy behind staff cars parked in the marked stalls, please wait until the drive through lane is completely open before attempting to merge back into the drive though lane. Those in the drive through, center lane please continue to proceed ahead.

Your kindness and patience towards fellow drivers and school community members is very much appreciated. It is requested that you continue to proceed ahead and not inadvertently back up traffic by letting those who are parked next to the drive through lane to merge back into the center lane.

## Parking Lot Safety Reminder

As well, once your vehicle has entered the school parking lot, you are required to complete the loop. Please DO NOT back up or attempt a quick u-turn, even if it is nearby the entrance/exit gate.

Families are also reminded to use the sidewalks and to not walk through the parking lot, between vehicles.
