
Welcome Back to School

Books per Student

During the school year, a student may have no more than 3 books on their account at any time. All students need to return their old books in order to take out any new library books.

If a student has not returned their overdue books they will be asked to pick a "Read and Return Book" to ensure that they have a book to read in the classroom and at home. An intermediate student with multiple missing books may be permitted to sign out an additional book to read in the classroom but it must stay at school until all missing books at home are returned.

Kindergarten - 1 Book

Grade 1 - 2 Books (1 "just right" and 1 "choice book").

Grade 2 - 2 Books (1 "just right" and 1 "choice book").

Grade 3 - 3 Books (1 "just right" and 2 "choice book").

Grade 4 - 3 Books (1 "just right" and 2 "choice book").

Grade 5 - 3 Books (1 "just right" and 2 "choice book").

Family Accounts - 10 Books per visit.

Damaged/Lost Books

If your child still has a lost or damaged book from last school year, they must pay to replace it before they borrow new books.

How Do Fines Work?

If a book has not been returned within 2 weeks of its due date, a notice may be sent home with the student for their parents. This was intended to help parents find the book, it is not a bill. If a book is returned damaged, a replacement bill may be sent home. Parents are responsible for replacing any damaged library books before their child can continue using the library. If a student has a book that is considered "lost" they could be asked to keep their library books in the classroom until the missing books are found at home (or in the classroom) and returned. Last year we had many books that were damaged by food, pets, water, and writing. Please be extra vigilant.

Family Accounts

Are you interested in borrowing books from our school library? With a family account, families can take out up to 10 books at a time and keep them for one week. The library is open most Friday's during the school year. During our Family Library Learning Commons Access Families are welcome to use this time to check out books. Accounts will be created at the time of your first visit. **Please keep in mind that parents or guardians only have access to family accounts. Students cannot sign out additional books on that account. **

SORA - Online Library

The SORA app has been set up to recognize everyone's Microsoft log in information.

For students login: They need to add <u>"@sd33online.ca"</u> and then their district password. Please contact your child's teacher for their information.

You should be able to download the app on your phone or ipad and log in using your district credentials. You can also go to soraapp.com on a computer. More things will be added in the next while, so keep checking it out. I believe it will be added to all iPads and laptops in the school eventually.

Kiwanis Super Reader

Make reading part of your daily routine and earn rewards!

The very successful "Super Reader" program will be back again this year. Students will receive an official green Super Reader Booklet the second week of school, after their first visit to the library. Every night a child reads for 15 minutes they receive a check mark in their booklet.
