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Fundraising Report: Bronwyn 7:40

- Have raised over \$6000 up to date
 - Excel Martial Arts – will drop off 30 passes (1-month classes, t-shirt)
 - Passes will be at the office
 - \$30 per pass (pure profit for school)
 - Mitchell's Soup set up for Feb/March
 - Neufeld Farms (spring)
 - Freezie Fridays will start up again May/June
 - Purdy's discussion for spring fundraiser
 - Spring is generally lighter profit then Christmas
 - Delivery prior to Easter

 - Ms. Winter requests \$150 US for Razz Kids Reading Program. Has been paying for this out of pocket
 - Noel mentioned that there is funding for school to pay for this
 - Question re Freedom of Information and where student information is kept. Program is safe and verified by the district
 - School will cover the cost for this request
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New Business: 7:57

- Mel presented idea of a Spring Carnival put on by PAC
 - She would spear head event
 - Event could include carnival games, food trucks, local business market, pony rides, magician, kids entrepreneur area
 - Discussion
 - Have done a spring carnival in the past
 - Lots of work
 - Not a lot of profit
 - Limited with what we can do due to insurance
 - Timing of event can be tricky with weather
 - Planning an event like this requires lots of planning (start in Sept for a spring event)
 - Suggestion was made to approach PHECSA to run a summer community event instead of a school event
 - PHECSA can run different programs due to renting space from the school
 - Lyndsay is willing to help Mel with this
 - Look into funding from City Block Party Grants
 - Connect with Promontory Church to see if they'd like to be involved
 - Mel will connect PHECSA to see if this can happen
 - AGM Question – Can incoming parents of students enrolled in kindergarten attend AGM and take a position on the executive?
 - Yes, they can attend the AGM
 - They do not get a vote and cannot be elected in
 - If there is a vacancy for a position they could be voted in at the September PAC meeting once their child is at the school
 - Garden Spaces
 - Currently not assigned to classes
 - Noel will put it out to teachers to see if anyone is interested in using these
 - Suggested that if they are empty PAC could look into seasonal plants that wouldn't require attention over the summer so that they are being used
